

A Celebration of Life Walter Lee Hundley January 13, 1930 ~ March 11, 2024

Walter Lee Hundley, 94, of McPherson, KS, passed away on Monday, March 11, 2024, with loving family by his side. He had been living with his grandson, Kyle and his wife, Andrea, in McPherson for the past 18 months.
