

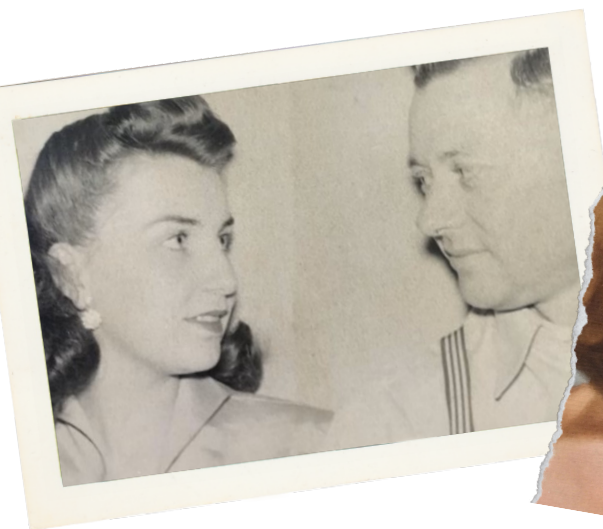

Ann Marie Kiser, 96, entered into rest on Friday, February 16, 2024.

Ann was born on May 11, 1927, in Florence, Alabama to the late James Robert and Maude Mae Carroll. She grew up in Smyrna, Georgia where she attended Fitzhugh Lee High School. She married her beloved Lt. Oscar J. Kiser in 1945. After WWII, they began their family and traveled extensively for 31 years. Living in Japan, Germany, and many states.
