

## *Donna Jean Sikorski*

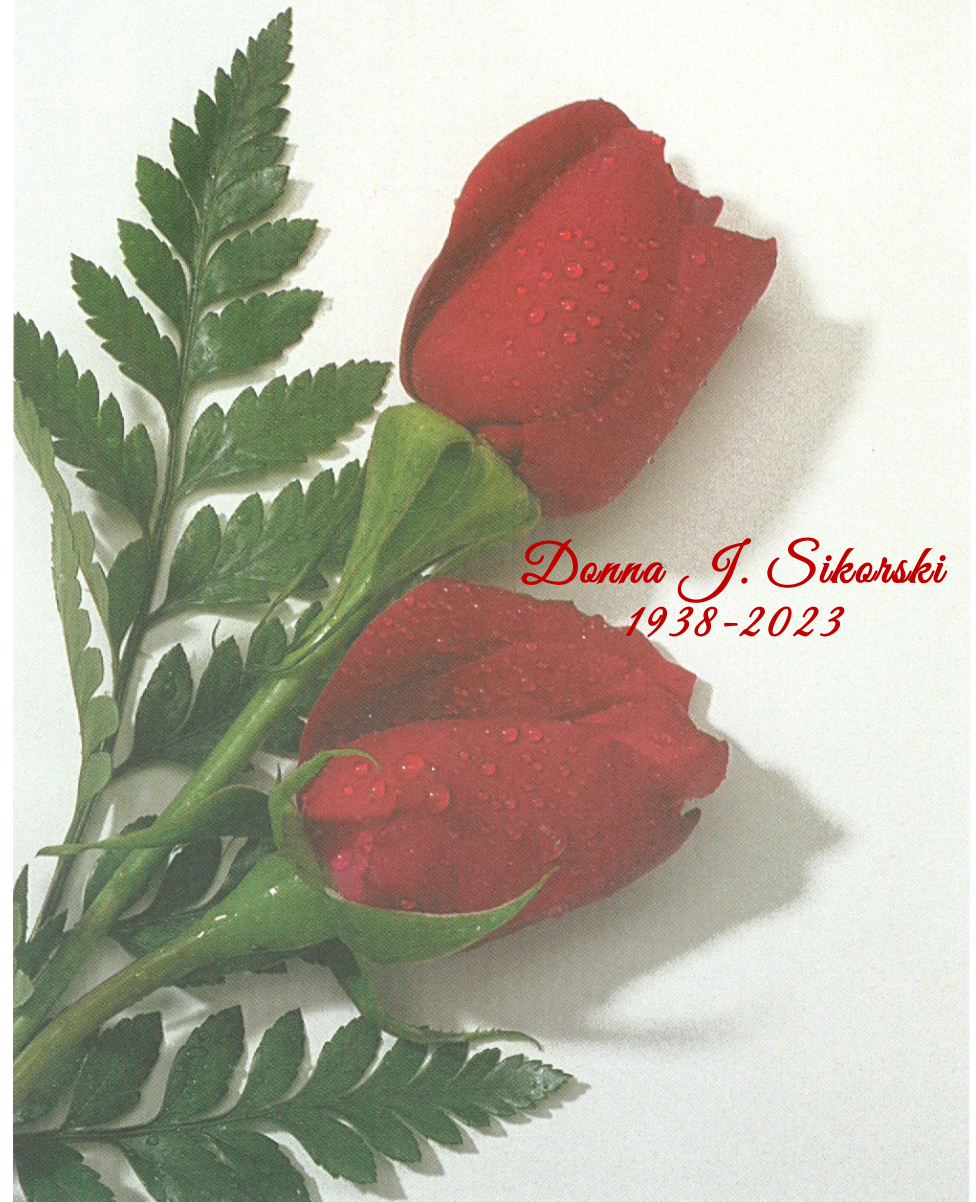
