

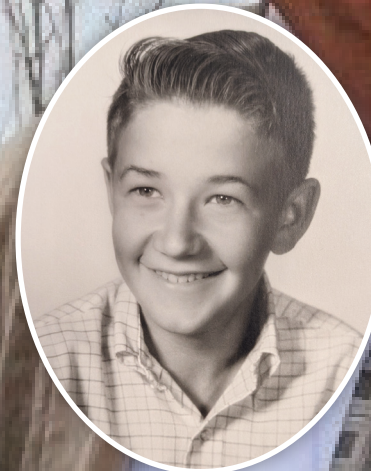
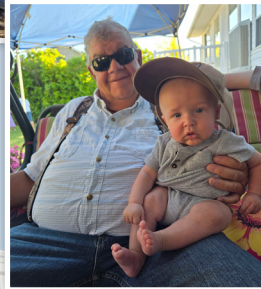
Close The Gate

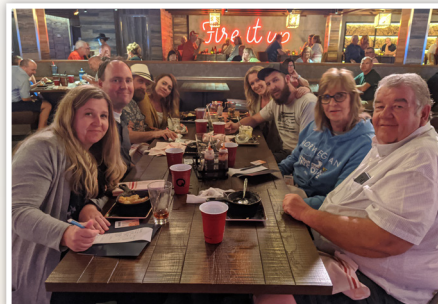
