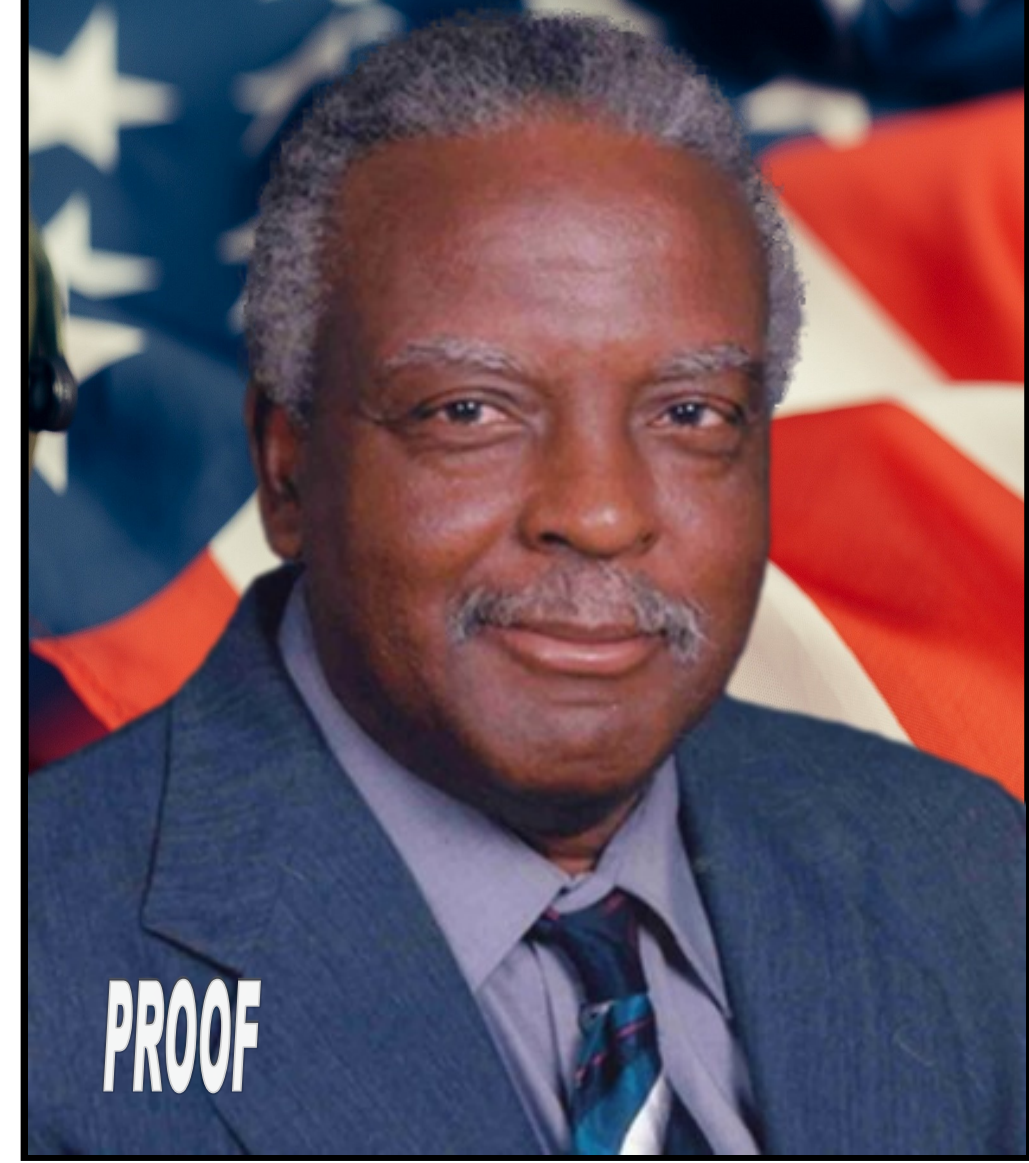

Obituary
