

William Jay "Rock" Anderson, the son of Theodore and Dorothy Anderson, was born on July 3, 1922, in Wadena, MN. Rock graduated from Wadena High School and continued his education at Carlton College. He enlisted into the United States Air Force for three years during WWII. After the war, he completed his college degree at Carlton College and then received his teaching certificate from the University of Minnesota.

Rock married Mary Lou Fallon on December 27, 1949, in St. Paul, MN. Together they lived in Sebeka, MN where Rock taught history and coached at the high school. In 1953, Rock and his family moved to Alexandria where he owned and operated W.J. Anderson Feed & Seed for 20 years. He later became the Douglas County Auditor and retired in the early 90's.


