Field Trip




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students earned an A or A+ and there were some solid B's and C's.

This week in 5/6 grade we continue to read from, "War of the Invisibles," the Amazing story of the Great Controversy. We watched videos of Elijah and Esther, prophets of God.

In English the students are practicing their skits so we can make them into movies next week.

We made a mini composting pile in a plastic container in our classroom.

The students dug for worms and added them to the compost we made this week. Now we will observe as the worms transform our table scraps and shredded paper into compost.

The 5th graders learned more about division and practiced dividing multi-digit numbers. They also learned to divide using partial quotients. The 6th graders are learning to use PEMDAS to figure out equations using fractions.

In Social Studies the students learned to read different kinds of maps and graphs.

Please remind students to read AR books and study for MV, vocabulary and spelling tests. There will be a Science test over chapter 1 on Monday. Study guides were completed on Wednesday and sent home. Have a great weekend!
