Gerald (Jerry) Ray Prettyman, 87, *of Alexandria, MN* lost his battle with prostate cancer on September 4, 2023 at St Williams Living Center in Parkers Prairie, MN

Gerald (Jerry) Ray Prettyman was born November 10, 1935 in Minneapolis, MN, the son of Jerome (Jerry) Hersch and Ella Alvina (Betty) (nee Beckman) Ward. He was adopted by Roy Prettyman. Jerry moved to the Verndale -Wadena area where he grew up helping on Roy and Betty's farm taking care of the cattle and sheep, working in the fields, and learning how to make repairs on the farm machinery. Due to having to work on the farm, he was only able to attend through the 10th grade.

They were married on November 30, 1956 at USNH Bethesda Chapel. After his discharge, Jerry became a lifelong member of the VFW and the American Legion.

Jerry and Millie were blessed with two children, Gerald (Jerry) Jr. and Sue. They moved to Minneapolis and he started his career in medical equipment sales with Aloe Medical. They transferred him to Huron, S.D., where he started traditions of family fishing, hunting with friends, and cross-country vacations with his family, including the 1964-65 World's Fair. During his time with Aloe Medical, he continued his training and received the Diamond Sales Award for reaching one million dollars in sales. He would often go into the operating room to train physicians how to use medical devices during surgery. He was transferred to Duluth where he enjoyed taking his young son smelt fishing. The family moved to Cloquet, MN where Jerry was promoted to Branch Manager for the Burdick Corporation in the sales of physical therapy and electronic medical devices.

Along the way, Jerry enjoyed many opportunities to meet, train, and work with thousands of medical professionals. Jerry's skills included fixing not only medical equipment but just about anything mechanical, including the many cars he restored and sold over the years, including Mustangs, a 1947 Chevrolet Sedan Delivery Street Rod, and "My Last One". He was a member of the Vintage Car Club for over 25 years. He appreciated all of the wonderful friendships he made and enjoyed cruising with them. He loved lending a hand in the car shows they participated in. Jerry was a perfectionist when it came to restoring his classic autos and earned many show trophies for his work.

Ever a people person, he loved spending time with his family and friends. He was a master story teller and often entertained those around him with jokes and personal tales. He was generous and always willing to help and share what he had. Jerry enjoyed hunting, fishing, spending time on the lake, snowmobiling, and working on his "toys". Hardly ever missing a game, he loved cheering on his grandchildren and their teammates in their golf and hockey games. Friends and family could always count on a big hug from him.

Jerry is survived by his wife, Millie; his son, Gerald (Hathi) Prettyman Jr of Pleasanton, CA.; his daughter, Sue (Ted) Justice of Alexandria, MN; 3 grandchildren, Kevin Justice of Fairfield, Iowa, David (Chelsey) Justice of Alexandria, MN, and Danielle (Ryan) Strayer of Queenstown, New Zealand; 3 great-granddaughters, Imogen, Emilia, and Isabelle.
