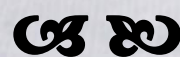

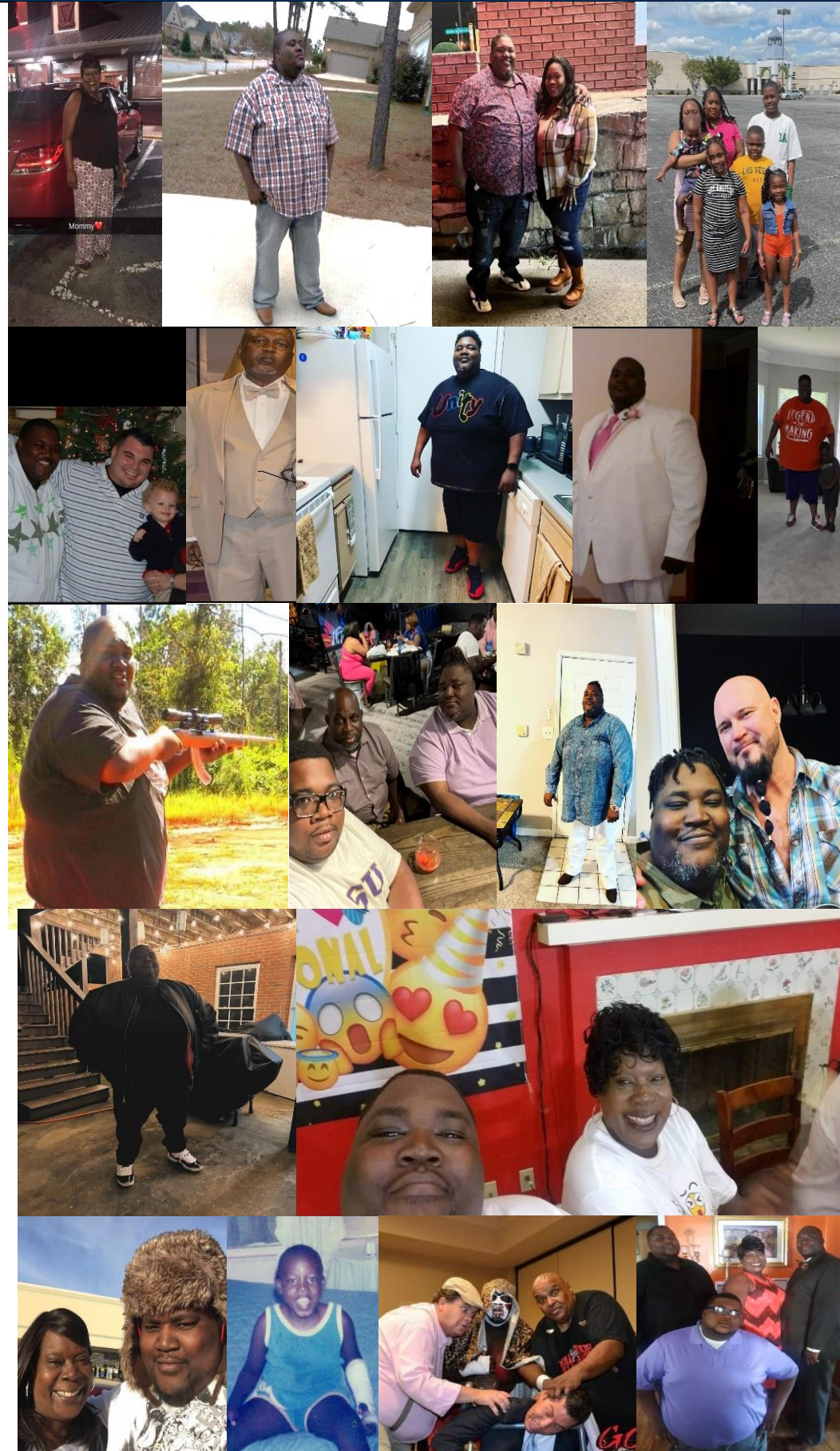
Kimbro was employed by Sprout Behavioral Agency and Positive Change Counseling in Lithonia, Georgia.
