He attended grade school in LaBolt and later graduated from Milbank High School in 1966. Dale worked at the Herald Advance newspaper in Milbank during high school and after graduating worked for Honeywell in Minneapolis before he was drafted into the United States Army in March 1969. Dale was honorably discharged in February 1971. He was awarded: National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Combat Infantryman Badge Air Medal, and Bronze Star Medal.
