## **PART 1— Match Fixing**

Q Squash recognises that betting is a legitimate pursuit, however illegal or fraudulent betting is not. Fraudulent betting on sport and the associated Match-fixing is an emerging and critical issue globally, for sport, the betting industry and governments alike.

Q Squash condemns Match-fixing and any corruption of in our sport.

Given the complex and ever changing position regarding Match-fixing and corruption in sport, Q Squash has fully adopted the Squash Australia Match-fixing Policy. This policy may be viewed on the Squash Australia Website – [www.squash.org.au](http://www.squash.org.au)

All members of the Q Squash and Regional Boards must hold Keep Sport Honest recognition.

All players competing at State, National and Internationally must hold Keep Sport Honest recognition.

All Officials i.e. coaching staff, managers, referee's etc. traveling with a State, National or International Team must hold Keep Sport Honest recognition.

Team or player Entourage (Parents, Guardians, Other Family, etc.) traveling with a State, National or International Team must hold Keep Sport Honest recognition

It is recommended that all parents of players under the age of 18 years of age hold Keep Sport Honest recognition

It is recommended Tournament Directors and volunteers assisting with juniors hold a Keep Sport Honest recognition

On completion of Keep Sport Honest courses, the completion certificates must be provided to both Q Squash to be saved on a database for future reference.
