That same year they bought a locker and meat processing plant and called it Schell Meat Service. In 1964 the family built a new home, pink house with white brick. Clarence and Dolores worked side by side creating a family business in the Reynolds Grocery. They also made investments in real estate. Dolores was a real asset, doing the book work, billing, collecting, but shined best at customer service. She had the ability to make everyone feel special. She was the quintessential mom, grandma, great-grandma and friend. Her faith showed in everything that she did. She loved Jesus and taught us all about the Bible and how to live for Him.
