

Easter is fast approaching and it is lovely to see signs of life in the garden with bulbs coming up and the first lot of daffodils adding some colour to Clevedon.

Normally we would be planning our normal Good Friday service in Queens Square but this year due to the Covid it would not be sensible or right to draw a crowd of people in the square, however we want to do something to publicity mark this important day.

Therefore we are going to put the Cross up in the Square on Good Friday as usual and have a space for you to come and place some flowers. We would like to have a larger display spelling out the word HOPE. It will be in place from 9:30am until 5:00pm.

So there is something for the children in the square, we are going to have a QR code to scan and this will take them to the CtiC website to watch a short film about Easter.

According to the road map by the 2nd of April we are allowed to gather with another household or the rule of 6 outdoors.

Maybe you could use this as an opportunity to connect with a friend or neighbor and invite them to come with you bringing some flowers as a public act of remembrance.

We want to keep everyone safe and if you feel this is not for you we are looking at other ways we can gather later in the year as the churches to thank God for his protection over us and remember those we have sadly lost.
