He also enjoyed spending time fishing and camping with his friends and family. Harry was a huge supporter of his children's, and later grandchildren's, sporting events and extracurricular activities. He loved a good game of Pitch, up at the Lazy H or spending a Sunday watching football. You could often find him uptown in the early morning sharing a cup of coffee with his friends, catching up on life.

In Harry's later years, he took up collecting license plates from the State of South Dakota. He collected a full set of every license plate from the State of South Dakota.
