

OBITUARY

DR. FLENOY BENJAMIN RICHARDSON II SEPTEMBER 27, 1948 – JUNE 13, 2024

Flenoy Benjamin Richardson II was born to Flenoy B. Richardson Sr. and Ruby Lee Richardson in Dallas, Texas, on September 27, 1948. He was the second-born son among seven children. Growing up on the Southside of Dallas, he attended Dunbar Elementary School. At the age of 12, Ruby moved her family to Los Angeles, California, for better opportunities. Flenoy attended 99th Street School, and thanks to the firm foundation in Christ set by Ruby, he never participated in or even considered gangs, drugs, alcohol, or any other vices that made living in LA difficult for most young people.

Flenoy was a great student, excelling in math and participating in track and field as a runner baseball as a pitcher, and basketball. In his younger days, he was known for his exceptional dancing skills and was a big fan of the Motown sound and old standards. These moves would become his trademark, not only in his youth but also as a praiser in the kingdom.

In addition to his dancing skills, Flenoy had an infamous singing voice and sang in several groups, often performing the falsetto parts of popular songs. He graduated from John C. Fremont High School in 1967.

After finishing high school, Flenoy pursued a life of service in the military. His original desire was to become an airman, but according to his brother, "they didn't get back to him soon enough," so he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps (USMC) on March 10, 1968. This decision would lead Flenoy to his biggest testimony.

During his time serving in the Vietnam War, as a leader of his platoon, while doing a sweep of the area, Flenoy encountered a booby trap and was thrown into the air. While the two soldiers next to him were blown apart, Flenoy lost his finger and almost lost his left leg, But, GOD. For this injury, he received the distinguished Purple Heart and several other military honors for his leadership. After this life-changing experience, Flenoy was absolutely convinced that he had been spared to worship and lead people to Christ. In 1970, he accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior and was later ordained as an Elder in 1987. He was a faithful member of the Revival Time Church of God in Christ, where he learned and received the gift of directing the choir under the leadership of Charles Bennet Sr. It was also here that he met the absolute love of his life, Ms. Terry Ann Robinson. They were married on March 10, 1973. God gave him his heart's song in Terry, and with her encouragement, love, and support, he became one of the best choir directors on the West Coast. With his gift, absolute love, and adoration, she became one of the most well-known sopranos in the choir circuit during this time. They went on countless tours and were featured on several recordings with some of gospel's most legendary choirs, led by luminaries such as Dr. Mattie Moss Clark and Dr. Ira Stevenson. However, their most treasured experiences were those with his best friend Elder Tony McGill. Tony and Flenoy had a 50-year friendship, as their churches often fellowshipped with each other.

I remember visiting my grandparents and we were eating at Cheesecake Factory. We were all laughing and listening to Grandpa tell a story; when the waiter attempted to take his plate away. When Grandpa noticed he gently slapped his hand and said, " No No No, I'm not finished". The waiter apologized and then laughed along with the family. I will miss you!







Finding the right words in the English language to express the depth of what you mean to me feels impossible. It has been my dream to be someone's granddaughter to truly feel like I belong in a family. You and grandma gave me this gift. You allowed me to see that love has no bounds and that blood relation means absolutely nothing when it comes to how much you can care for an individual. I am grateful that you made my dad. I'm grateful that you gave me, so many years of love, advice, and laughter. I will forever miss you and our conversations. Granpaw, the oil that you made me I will keep close to my heart forever. Love you it is my prayer that you're in heaven, reminiscing and reconnecting with all those who went before you. I pray that you got a chance to see Ashley and that one day when it is my turn I get a chance to reunite with you.

Flenoy and Terry were blessed with three children: Teira, Flenoy III, and Shawn. He was a great father who had the perfect mix of discipline and love. He was always fair, and always loving, and created an atmosphere of love and respect in his home. Professionally, he received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Business Administration from L.A. Southern College. Flenoy was a dedicated employee of Rockwell International as an accountant for 19 years. After being laid off during an economic crisis, like his mother before him, Flenoy moved the family to Las Vegas, Nevada, for better opportunities. He went on to lend his accounting talent to RLW, working with his brother-in-law Jackie Robinson as a senior manager until his retirement. While leaving home and their home church was a very emotional and difficult decision, Flenoy found his new home and family at Pentecostal Temple Church of God in Christ under the leadership of Bishop Leon Smith, whom he served as assistant pastor. At Pentecostal Temple, his fatherhood took on new meaning as he became a spiritual mentor, surrogate father, and grandfather to many, including Jemel McClendon, Orlander Anderson, and Derrick Huggins, whom he loved like his own.

In his later years, Flenoy fulfilled a lifelong dream by receiving his Doctorate in Divinity in 2018 and became one of the most revered instructors for Kingdom Builders Bible Seminary School. He continued to inspire and mentor countless individuals through his deep faith, wisdom, and unwavering commitment to service. Flenoy's legacy is one of faith, love, resilience, and dedication. He touched the lives of all who knew him and left an indelible mark on his community, family, and church. His life was a testament to the power of faith and the importance of family, service, and leadership.


