Reflections from the Rector (designate)...



The season of Advent is a time to reflect on the unexpected nature of Jesus humble birth and join in the anticipation of when he will come again to reunite Heaven and Earth once and for all.

As we await Christ's return we have been reminded in the parables of Christ in Matthew's Gospel, to be prepared and ready, we are to use all that God has gifted us with - our money, talents, gifts, resources and time - to share God's love with those in need.



It is easy to share God's love with those we like, our friends and family, those whom we favour. The message of the parable of the sheep and the goats, preached on the Feast of Christ the King (Sunday 26th November 2023) makes clear the work to which we are called.

It reminds us that God will judge us according to our response to human need.

How we treat the least in society - the poor, the homeless, the asylum seeker, the refugee, the disabled, the mentally ill, the disaffected - shows what we think of Christ. Is he really King of our lives? Is he really King of our Church?

The culmination of the Parish Away Day and its distillation of comments, words both spoken and written, highlighted the importance and desire of growing in discipleship of Christ for all ages.

There were particular concerns for children and youth, the environment regarding church buildings and grounds and growing/nurturing the church community as well as the wider community. The new parish wide vision for All Saints' and St Antony's in the Parish of Sanderstead and key priority areas on which to focus, agreed by the PCC is:

Growing in Christ. Working together with the community and sharing God's love.

<u>Priority areas over next 2-3yrs</u>
Children and Youth
Environment (buildings and grounds)
The church community and the wider community

In the new year there will be an invitation to form Working Groups for each of these areas. These will involve a variety of people from the congregations across both churches, with passion for a particular area.

They will meet to discuss some ideas and put forward some actions/projects to work towards achieving over the next 2-3 years.

These actions will be agreed by the PCC as the church's 2-3yr Mission Action Plan.



Everything we decide on should be inspired by the desire to see people growing in the knowledge and love of Christ, working together with each other, as well as the wider community in order to share God's love.

I pray that In this coming season of Advent and Christmas we would examine our hearts, reflecting on the gifts that God has given each one of us and indeed the gifts of our buildings, grounds and other resources. May we truly seek to live as citizens of the Kingdom of God being prepared and willing to share his gifts with those in need, as we venture into a new season for the Church.

We always receive a thank you from residents and staff and it is a good way to keep in touch with the residents living there.

The red chair initiative

Mothers' Union.

Have you seen the red chair in All Saints' Church?

As part of the United Nations 16 Days of Activism against gender based violence (25 November - 10 December) Mothers' Union (MU) has placed this red chair in church to highlight that globally, every 11 seconds, a woman or girl dies at the hand of an intimate partner or family member. These women or girls should still be with us.

We like to think that we stand for strong healthy families. But sadly, that is not always true. Marriage breakdown, emotional abuse and physical violence happen in relationships across communities, churches and cultures.

One important thing we can do is remind ourselves of how God views heathy, happy marriages and families.

And we can also acknowledge the extent and pain of abuse.

We can commit to responding compassionately to those who suffer, and to aid in their healing through practical and spiritual support: listen to women who say they are abused and take them seriously; create safe spaces where survivors are listened to, believed and loved.

Pray with them. We don't have to be experts and if there is a case of abuse, seek professional guidance. Domestic Abuse can affect individuals and families of all backgrounds. It can happen to anyone from any walk of life If you ever have concerns contact one of our Parish safeguarding Officers.



The Geoffrey Coffin Organ part 1...

The Geoffrey Coffin organ in St Antony's Church started life as a somewhat unique and controversial project.

In 1970 the St Antony's Team Vicar at that time was a pipe organ enthusiast and Geoffrey Coffin was the parish organist at All Saints'. Geoffrey was invited to draw up a scheme to acquire a second-hand pipe organ and rebuild it in St Antony's using help from the congregation with a team led by the vicar, the Rev John Hamilton.



During the summer of 1970, pipework and soundboards were acquired via a student's bedroom in Thames Ditton and transported back to Hamsey Green. A working party from the men's social group was formed and work commenced on cleaning the pipework. New direct electric chests for the bottom octaves of the 8' fluework, Swell reed and Pedal division were constructed by Geoffrey together with new electro-pneumatic actions for the Swell and Great organs, pneumatic stop actions and new reservoirs for the winding. The soundboards were overhauled, splits attended to and slider seals fitted. The building team led by the vicar assembled the building frame, installed the chests, built the mobile console and installed the low voltage wiring. The organ was completed over two years and Geoffrey gave the opening recital on the 16th February 1973. The Organ stands in memory of Mr Kenneth Eagle, a member of the building team, who died in a motor accident whilst the organ was being constructed. His widow Audrey provided continuing financial support for the upkeep of the instrument until she died in 2014.



In the early hours of Christmas Eve 2013, the church roof suffered major storm damage and the organ suffered major water damage. It was estimated that vast sums of money would be needed for it to be repaired.

During investigations this year, by Revd Carol, to remove the organ in order to build in extra storage space for the church, the diocesan Organ Inspectors found that the organ was playing very well with only a few keys not playing and stated there was nothing to justify its removal it just needed tuning!







The Geoffrey Coffin Organ part 2...

This would cost at least £812 for a regular annual tuning contract and the organ would need playing regularly to keep in good condition. Derek Funnell, a previous Church Warden came to mind.

After sending him a copy of the newsletter, Revd Carol asked if he would be willing to come and tune the organ (he had done this in previous years but now lives in Wiltshire).



Derek and his wife Hilary were so pleased to hear that St Antony's had re-opened as a parish church again that they agreed to tune the organ as a labour of love, in thanks to God. Derek had also helped to build this organ when he was a teenager!

The Geoffrey Organ Pipe organ is now fully functioning and tuned and will be re-launched at the Carol Service at St Antony's on December 10th at 3pm. John Jones will be the Organist and there will be a joint All Saints' and St Antony's Choir. Revd Cecil Heatley, another St Antony's previous Team Vicar from the 70's, will be the Speaker at this service. All are very welcome to come.


