The day God called you home.**

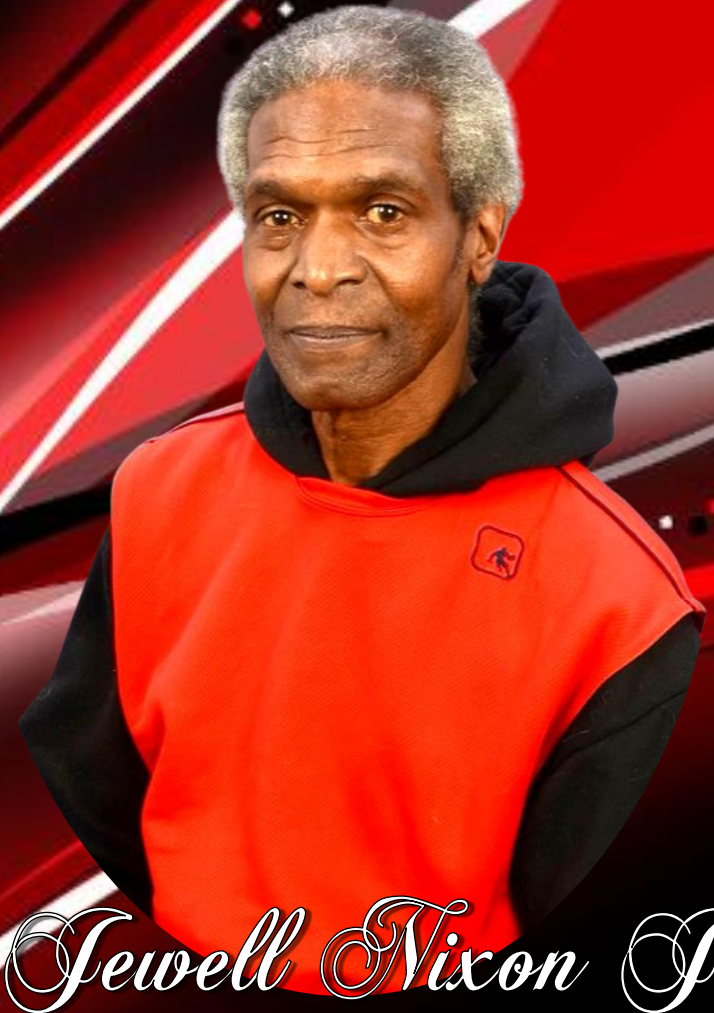
**You left us peaceful memories.
