Students who are not enrolled in Before Care may be dropped off no earlier than 7:50 a.m.

Before/After Care

The Before/Aftercare Program started on Tuesday, August 27, 2019. Attendance is taken for all students who are enrolled in the program. This is done to ensure that your child is present and accounted for. All parents or assigned guardians are required to sign their child out of aftercare. If your child's name is not listed on the sheet, the supervisors of the program will ask you if you have registered for the program.

Before care begins at 7:00 a.m. Aftercare begins at 3:30 p.m. Monday-Thursday and 1:30 on Friday. Any student found at school after those times will be placed in aftercare, and the parents are required to pay the daily fee. No child is allowed to remain on the campus unsupervised. The daily fee of \$13.50 is required when you pick up your child. If you do not pay on that day, the charge is \$15.00. There are no exceptions.

Hot Lunch Program

Our Hot Lunch Program will begin on the first day of school. Attached is a letter informing parents of the hot lunch application form. We will no longer be accepting cash for lunches and the orders must be placed online by 5am the day lunch is desired.

Parking

Parents, we are asking that you do not park in the fire lane or behind the principal's car at anytime at the Alabama Avenue Campus. If an emergency happens, the principal must have unencumbered access in and out of the building and between campuses. We are trying to avoid placing tickets on cars that continue to park in that area. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

program structure:

- This chapter has a limited number of seats for students representing grades 5-8.
