Investing her heart in the work that she does,

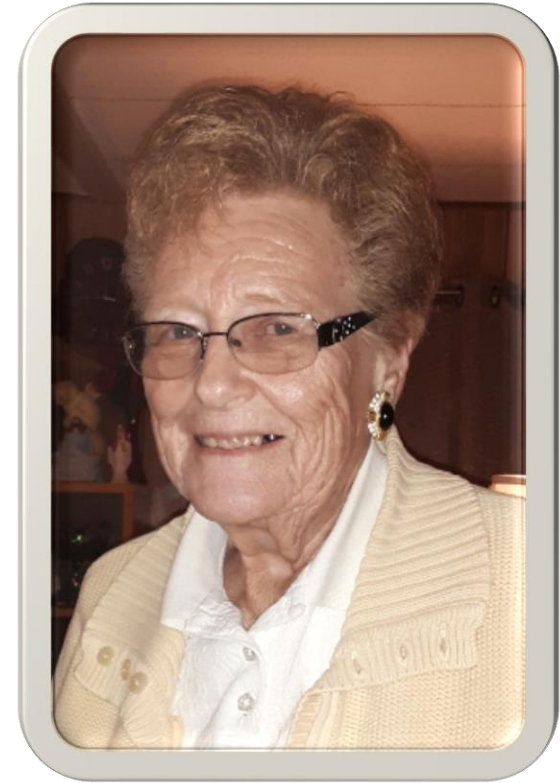
