Rose Ann Freidel was born Saturday, May 4, 1929 in Lesterville to Albert and Rose (Novak) Freidel, the fifth of six children. She lived on the Freidel family homestead attending a rural grade school nearby.

Graduating in 1946 from Yankton High School, she went on to obtain her teaching certificate that summer and began teaching in the fall at the rural school she attended as a child. She was only 17 years old.

She married Marvin (Dick) Petzoldt on September 23, 1948 in Lesterville. They began farming near Scotland. In 1958 they purchased a farm north of Yankton where they raised their four children.

Rose went on to college and received her Bachelor’s Degree in Elementary Education in 1972 from Yankton College. She continued to teach at rural schools in the area and at Lesterville Elementary School. She taught school for 35 years retiring in 1990.

Rose and Marvin retired from farming in 1980 and moved to Scotland where they enjoyed being “back home” and serving others. She and Marvin enjoyed traveling and attended 23 reunions of the Survivors of the USS Savannah (the ship Marvin served on).

Rose was a life member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary, American Legion Auxiliary and the Disabled American Veterans Auxiliary (serving three years as state commander). She was a member of St. George Catholic Altar Society, Senior Citizens, Good Samaritan Society Auxiliary and Scotland Preservation Commission.

Rose, age 90, passed away on Saturday, January 4, 2020 at the Good Samaritan Society in Scotland.

She will be missed by her two daughters, Darlene (Dan) Huntimer of Watertown, Deb (Paul) Dummer of Lesterville and two sons, Richard and Duane both of Scotland; nine grandchildren; eight great grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 64 years Marvin in 2013; her parents; two brothers; three sisters and one grandson.
