Prefor Phenix was born on May 18, 1947 in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was one of nine children. Pastor Phenix was a native and resident of Bridge City, Louisiana. He attended Lincoln High School. Pastor Phenix was reared by Godly parents who instilled in him the importance of knowing and having a personal relationship with the Lord. He heard the word, accepted Christ and was baptized in 1959 at Second Salvation Baptist Church in Bridge City, Louisiana by the late Reverend Joseph Howard. 
This is why your legacy will always be!!
