## **Pastoral Care Pillar**



#### **Envelopes for the next financial year**

Boxes of envelopes for the next financial year are now available for collection at the back of the church.

The boxes include 12 envelopes for the monthly Maintenance/Buildings Fund collections but if you do not have your envelope with you when you come to Mass there are spare envelopes available. If you no longer need the envelopes which have been ordered for you, please let the parish office know or put the envelopes into the box for unused envelopes.

The diocese has also provided multi-purpose envelopes, which can be used for Mass Intentions and any special collections, including the Christmas and Easter offerings. These envelopes are available from the welcomers at Mass. If you are a Gift Aider you do not need to write your name and address every time, provided that you show your Gift Aid number and tick the fund to which you are donating.

The Maintenance/Church Building fund is very important to the finances of the parish, partly because we have several projects due to be completed but also because donations to this fund do not attract the 30% levy which is used for the central expenses of the diocese. #### No Mow May

Say 'No to the Mow' Campaign this May (or all summer)

Leave some or all of you lawn uncut during May and join the "No Mow May" so that flowers are allowed to develop provide food for pollinators.

- Long grass:
- · Provides food and shelter for many butterflies & moths
- Invertebrates and seeds flourish in long grass which provides food for the birds
- Undisturbed grassland is good for carbon capture and storage
- Wild lawns provide foraging opportunities and shelter for hedgehogs, toads, and frogs but check for hedgehogs before strimming or mowing
- · Grassland insects which fly at night are food for bats!

If you have a garden let part of your lawn grow long all this summer or set the lawn mower cutting height to a high setting.

I am writing to express our deepest gratitude for St James' (et al.) generous contributions to our Foodbank during the giving season. Your support has made an immense difference in the

lives of Bromley residents who are currently struggling to cover the cost of essentials.

Thanks to the collective efforts of 29 churches, including yours, we were able to gather a remarkable 1,816KG worth of food donations. This abundance of provisions enabled us to assemble 7-day food parcels, which were distributed to over 90 individuals facing food insecurity in our local community.

Your kindness and dedication to serving those in need is truly commendable. Your donations have not only provided essential support, but also brought hope and reassurance to many during these challenging times. Please share our sincere gratitude with all who contributed!

In addition to our heartfelt thanks, I am excited to share some news with you! We will be welcoming a new Church Engagement Volunteer to our team in mid-May. Their role will be to strengthen our relationship with the religious community and explore ways to provide a more comprehensive exchange between the Foodbank and Churches. They will be reaching out to you soon to hear your thoughts and ideas on how we can enhance our collaboration to better support the people we serve.

Once again, thank you for your unwavering support and commitment to making a positive impact in the lives of others. We are deeply grateful for your partnership and look forward to continuing our journey together as we work to create a more compassionate and supportive community for all.

I am running the London Marathon in memory of my wonderful Nanna, Anita Rowland, who we sadly lost in May last year. Nanna was an incredible lady who lived a wonderful life and set the perfect example for our growing family, whom she cherished. She taught us how to be kind of heart, to love deeply, to care truly and be the best version of ourselves that we can be. She was loved by everyone that she crossed paths with. She was my Nanna, but was also a loving wife, mother, grandmother and great grandmother, and we all miss her more as each day passes.

Nanna had an underlying heart condition that contributed to her sudden and unexpected passing. In her honour, I am raising money for the British Heart Foundation, an incredible charity that is already close to my heart, having lost a beloved colleague to a sudden heart attack in 2021.

The British Heart Foundation's vision is a world without heart and circulatory diseases. A world without heartbreak. 76p of every £1 raised is spent on life saving research, translating to spending over £100 million on research projects each year into all heart and circulatory diseases and the things that cause them.

#### "READING GENESIS" by Alan Pavelin

The American writer Marilynne Robinson is best-known for her "Gilead" novels, four books centred around two elderly ministers and their families in 1950s Iowa. Published between 2004 and 2020, these novels (Gilead, Home, Lila, and Jack) can be read in any order, the same events being seen from different perspectives, namely the central character of each book.

Robinson, who is a lay preacher in her Congregational church, is immensely knowledgable about Christian history and theology, as is evidenced in several books of essays she has produced. The one I have, The Givenness of Things, consists of 17 essays with titles like Grace, Servanthood, and Awakening.

Her latest book, which came out in March, is Reading Genesis, an extended meditation on the first book of the Old Testament. She is clearly bringing a novelist's eye to the material, and brings to life the famous stories in it, particularly those around Abraham and Joseph and their families. Her impressive knowledge of ancient Babylonian texts, with their story of a Great Flood, enables her to compare it with the Genesis version and conclude that, while the Babylonian deities acted to benefit themselves, our Abrahamic God acts for the benefit of His creation.

For anyone wanting a real insight into the Book of Genesis, and perhaps to read it in a new way, I thoroughly recommend Marilynne Robinson's book.
