Donald Edward Bugbee was born on July 28, 1938, in Fergus Falls, Minnesota, the son of Lyle and Alice (Henjum) Bugbee. He grew up and received his education in Elbow Lake. He later attended bible school in Alberta, Canada and earned his Minister certification. Donald was a licensed Lay Minister through the Harbor Four Square Gospel Church.
