A Love Letter To Mother Earth

Alan Pavelin Monthly Film Review

Over a dozen films have been made about Joan of Arc, the 15th century teenager who, claiming visions and messages from saints, dressed as a man, led the French army against the English, was burned at the stake for heresy, and was canonised in 1920. By general critical consent the best of the films by far is The Passion of Joan of Arc (1928) by the Danish director Carl Dreyer, based on the actual transcript of Joan's trial. Because sound equipment was not yet available at the Paris studio where it was made, it is a "silent" film, though invariably screened with music (I first saw it with a live orchestra).

What makes this film so great is the central performance by Renee Falconetti, in her only film, and in her mid-30s at the time. In "silent" films actors acted with their faces, not their voices, and this film consists largely of huge closeups, not just of Joan but of her accusers and the English soldiers guarding her in prison. It can be watched free on YouTube and is emotionally very powerful. Until 1981 the film could only be seen in mutilated form and with parts missing, because the original negative was thought lost. Then it was miraculously discovered in, of all places, a Norwegian mental hospital!

And talking of miracles, Carl Dreyer's later film Ordet (1955), meaning "The Word", ends with what is widely regarded as the most convincing "miracle" ever filmed, the raising of a character from the dead. Based on a play, the film tells of an old Jutland farmer having problems with his three sons: one has lost his Christian faith, one has lost his mind and thinks he is Jesus, while the third wants to marry a girl whose father is the leader of a rival Christian sect. Another intensely moving film but filmed in a very different style from the Joan of Arc one, slow stately camera movements with no close-ups.

Trustee Board Chair

The Chair will lead the Board of Trustees, ensuring that it fulfils its responsibilities within the Group. The Chair will work closely with the Group Scout Leader to achieve the purpose of The Scout Association through the development of local Scouting, in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

Treasurers' position

You will be required to reconcile expenditure, check bank statements and prepare financial information for the AGM, attend Trustee Board meetings which are held 3 or 4 times a year. You will also need to undertake some on line training as required by the Scout Association. The role does not require too much of your time, approximately 2-4 hours per month on average.

The role would suit someone with book keeping/banking/finance experience and who is experienced using Excel, it is an important and rewarding role supporting the Scout Group.

Secretary's position

This is an administrative position and would suit someone who has good IT and minute taking skills, you are required to arrange the Trustee Board meetings held each term, draft the minutes and distribute them, you will also arrange the paperwork for the AGM and take the minutes and assist the Scout Leader with any other administrative tasks. This role also does not take up too much time approximately 2-4 hours per month on average. You would be required to undertake some on line training. Membership Secretary

The responsibilities include:

- Maintaining Membership Records by having accurate record-keeping for all members in the Scout Group.
- Guiding potential new members through the registration process.
- Welcoming new members and promoting active involvement.
- Supporting the Board of Trustees
- Advising parents of the annual subscription rates and monitoring receipt of the subscription monies.
- Maintaining a Waiting List for the Group.

In summary, the membership secretary ensures accurate records, smooth registrations, and overall support for the Scout Group.




