But he always made sure we were taken care of on the school bus.

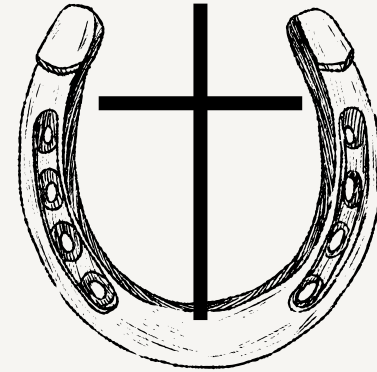
So God gained another angel today

Mickey will gladly take his rightful place in heaven at our Fathers feet.

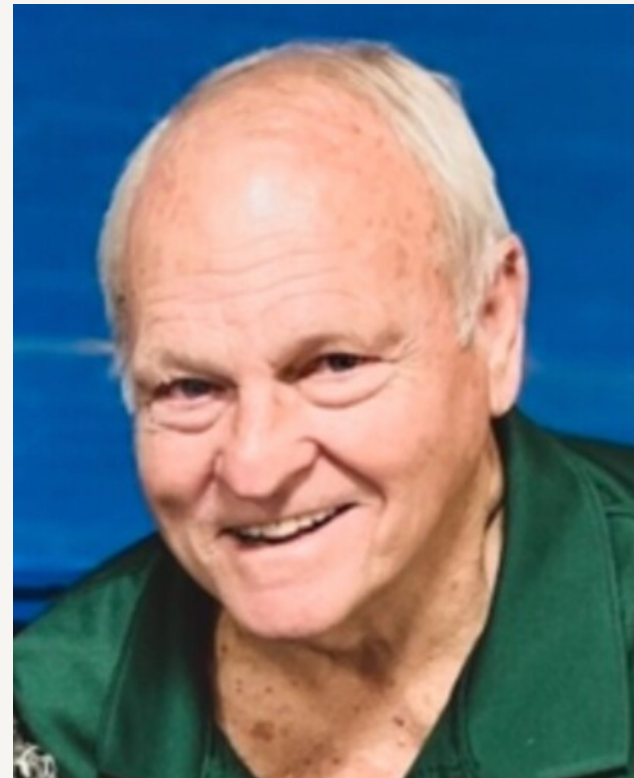
I know I will miss my brother so much

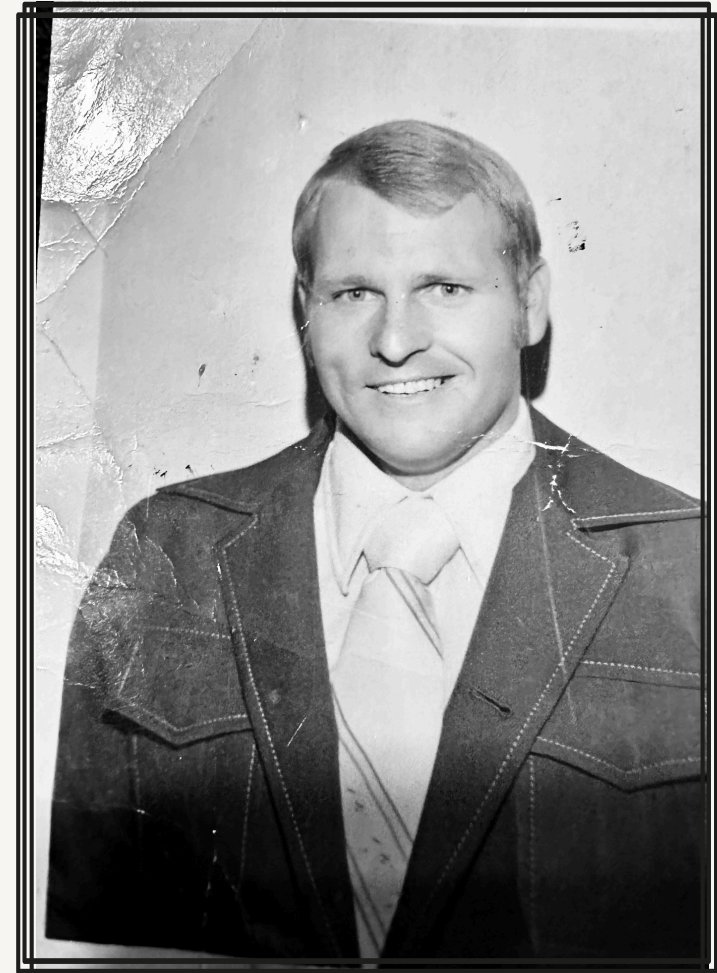
