Obituary

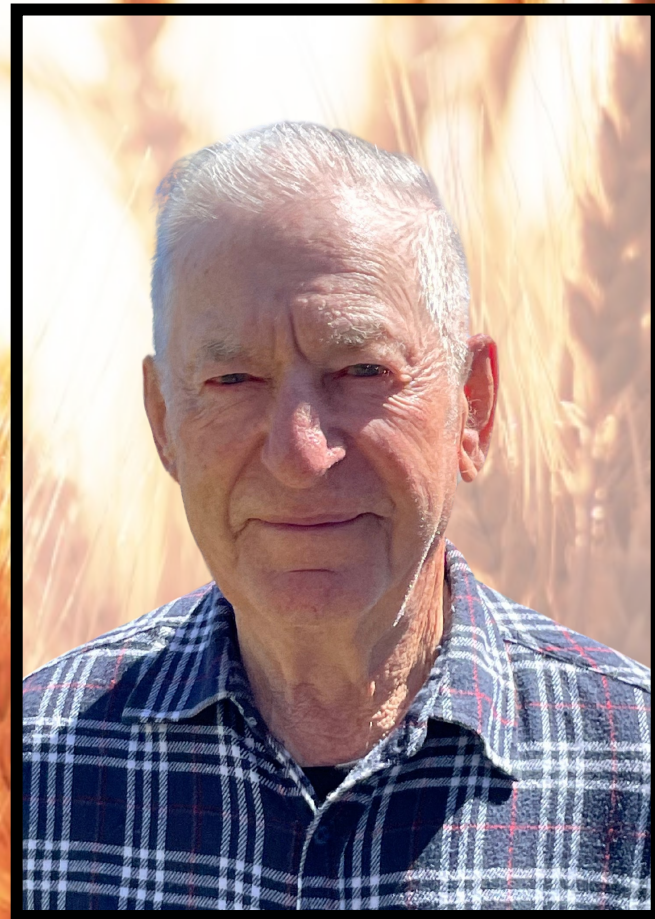
