Jim was a member of Our Lady of the Lake Catholic Church in Battle Lake, MN.

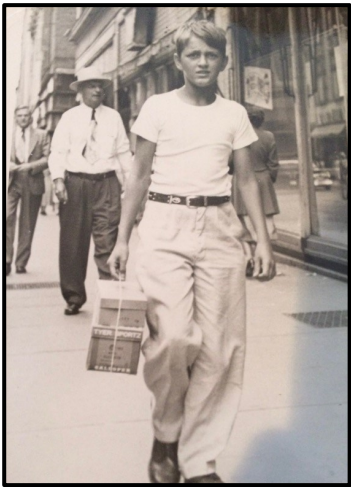
