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# STEPS TO REACHING AN INDIVIDUAL

#### STEP 1:

Talk on the phone with one person on your list of desired contacts. This is a casual conversation. You are not bringing up the study group.

#### STEP 2:

Do a fun activity with the person you called during the week.

#### STEP 3:

Do something for the person you called that will let the individual know that you care about him/her spiritually-- whether it's a prayer, a simple thing like saying that God will help you, a conversation about God, or talk to him/her about salvation. Let the Holy Spirit lead you to know what and when you should do this.

#### STEP 4:

Ask your desired contact if they would like to study the Bible with you. Make it very attractive and be positive about it.

*If they are interested* in having Bible studies, then set up a time that you guys can start for next week. (Refer to the next page)

If they are interested, but *your schedules don't match*, then find out all the times they are available, and pass that information to your team leader.

If they are not interested in having Bible studies, then go back to step 1 with another individual on your list.

#### STEP 5:

Do the Bible study series provided in this packet.

#### STEP 6:

When you finish all 9 lessons and if they desire to be baptized, then pass the information along to your team leader.

#### STEP 7:

Follow up with the individual. Check up on a regular basis to see how he/she is doing spiritually.

Once you have completed all the steps, repeat all the steps with another person from your list.

# **Bible Study Sessions**

**Choose a location.** You want this to be in a place that is easily assessable. This can be in your home, the other person's home, conference room, classroom, restaurant, or even at church on Saturdays. The most important thing is where the other person feel most comfortable.

**Choose a day and time.** Set up a day and time that works for both your schedules. It would be easiest if the days and time remain consistent, but also be willing to be flexible. Also agree as to how long the Bible Studies will be. Your Bible Studies are to be 1-1.5 hours. Try your best not to go over the agreed upon time.

**Call as a reminder.** Even if you think they will remember to come on their own, a phone call will also serve to encourage the individual to come.

**Be early to pray.** You want to be there early to use the time to relax and pray before the individual arrives. Prayer is power. If the Bible Study is at the person's home, still arrive early and use what time you have before the agreed upon time to pray before you enter the home.

**Checking Up Time.** Spend 5-10 minutes asking how the week went for the individual. Just get to know the person.

**Prayer.** Take some time to pray for any requests or thanksgiving that the person may have.

**Bible Study.** When you lead out the Bible Study, use the methods outlined in this packet. (Refer to the next page)

Nothing is carved in stone. Adjust when necessary to suit your group of people.

# **Leading A Bible Study**

# **Scriptures**

Ask the individual to read the passage of scripture that is outlined on your page.

**Restate the passage in your own words.** You are not interpreting the passage, just restating it.

# **Questions**

**Ask the individual the question that is outlined on your page.** If someone is having a hard time answering, restate your question in a simpler way. There are two types of questions here...

**Factual Question:** (These are the questions that are in bold.) They have a specific answer that you are looking for, based on the passage of scripture that is coupled with it.

If they get the question correct compliment them.

If they get the question wrong remain positive. Point them back to the passage and help them find the answer. If after a while they can't find the answer, then tell the answer. (The answers are found in regular type.)

**Open-Ended Question:** (These are the questions that are in bold italics.) These questions have don't have any particular right or wrong answer. It is based on the person's opinion.

**Restate the persons answer in your own words.** You are not interpreting their answer, just restating it. If they gave a long answer, give a summary of what they said.

**Make a transition.** After the questions, make a statement that will lead into the next passage.

**Make a conclusion.** Emphasize the good things that you guys have talked about in order to make a concluding thought to leave them with.

**Ask a closing rhetorical question.** This question is the appeal of your study. You want it to be personal. During this time, you want to call for a decision for the Lord.

Close with prayer.

# **Dealing with Questions**

If someone asks you a question, restate their question in your own words in order to make sure you understand it.

- If the question is not appropriate for this week's study...
  - o Tell the person that, that question will be covered in a later time.
- If the question is appropriate for this week's study...
  - Try your best to answer the question if you can. In order to prepare for possible questions, review the "Thought Questions" in your Amazing Facts Study guides
  - If you don't know the answer, say that you do not know, but will look into that and provide an answer next week.
