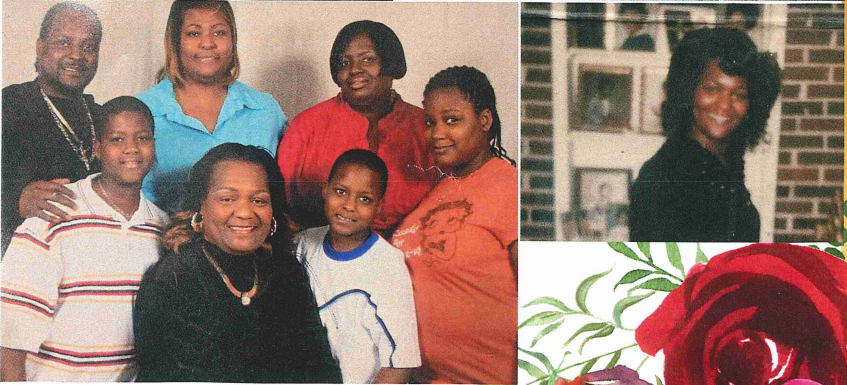

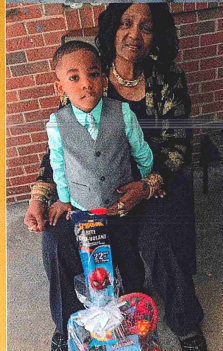
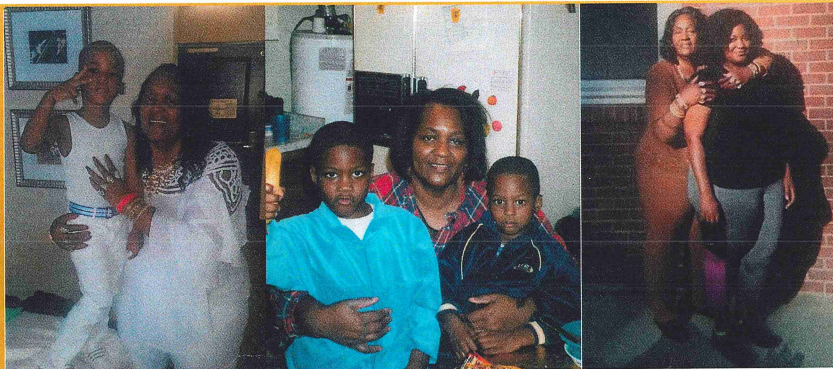
Ms. Ruby Mae Upshaw was born on August 3, 1945, in Hurtsboro, Alabama, to the late General Lee Upshaw Sr. and Ruby Lee Upshaw. She was the sixth of twelve siblings. Her siblings Nella Green Upshaw, Lola Louise Bryd, General Lee Jr., Jimmie Lee Upshaw, and William Upshaw preceded her in death.

After graduating from Northwestern High School in Detroit, Michigan, in 1965, Ruby Mae Upshaw went on to earn several degrees and certifications. In 1967, she relocated to Atlanta, Georgia, where she obtained her childcare and cosmetology licenses from Atlanta Public School and Apex School of Beauty. She later returned to school in 1977 to earn her cosmetology instructor's license and worked as an instructor at Atlanta Area Technical School until 1980.

In 1981, Ruby Mae moved to Savannah, Georgia, and opened her own hair salon, Woodsville Beauty Place, later renamed Woodsville Beauty Salon. For over 45 years, she worked as a master cosmetologist, helping many others earn their own cosmetology licenses.

Outside of her career, Ruby Mae enjoyed spending time with family, cooking and baking for others, doing community service, attending Litway Baptist Church, watching court shows, and bringing joy to those around her.

She is survived by her two children Dexter M. Treadwell Sr. (Kaone) and Deanna M. Worriels-Jackson (Jamal); four grandchildren Jade A. Treadwell, Dexter M. Treadwell Jr., Deon E. Treadwell, Elijah I. Bennett; two great-grandchildren, Elise L. Treadwell & Dexter M.
