No one can fill your vacant place.**

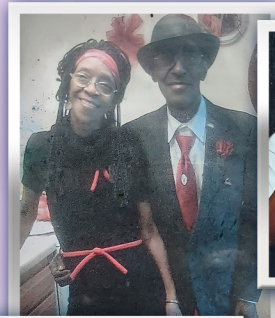

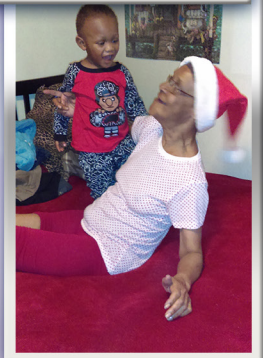
