

Donna enjoyed having Tracey help her out around the house or in the yard. They always found things to keep them busy. Spending the day together playing cards, having lunch or dinner, attending community events and celebrating holidays and special days together. Donna and Tracey had a very close relationship, spending a lot of time together, they were always busy making memories. Donna was very happy when her daughter Tracey married Dwayne Pond, she loved helping Tracey plan the wedding, helping pick items out for the big day and brainstorming how to make the wedding a very special day.
