Harold Schoenrock was born on September 3, 1936, in Minneapolis, Minnesota the son of Harold and Laura (Leuthard) Schoenrock. When Harold was 12 the family moved to Wheaton. At the age of 18 he joined the United States Army where he served his country for three years. After being Honorably Discharged he returned to



Wheaton for a short time before enlisting with the United States Marine Corps. Rocky served for 27 ¹/₂ years from 1955-1985. During his service he made several trips overseas where he served in Okinawa, Borneo, Japan, Philippines and Vietnam. Serving as a red patch Rocky sailed on troop ships, submarines, cargo ships, aircraft carriers and helicopter carriers. While in Vietnam Rocky was injured twice receiving two Purple Hearts.
