

She was the owner/operator of Carol Seymour Sales where she sold granite for many years, and later in life was an accomplished real estate agent having worked for Landmark Realty.

Always a socialite, Carol had a special love for Georgia football and enjoyed attending many games and hosting tailgate parties. She looked forward to visiting with her Thursday night dinner club and her bridge group that met each month. Her happy place was anywhere with sand, sun, and saltwater, but she had a special love of trips to Tybee and Hilton Head Islands. Carol was an avid collector of various items, but her true therapy was spending time digging in the dirt. She prided herself in taking care of her yard and flowers, and kept her corner of S. Thomas and Edwards Streets in immaculate condition.
