

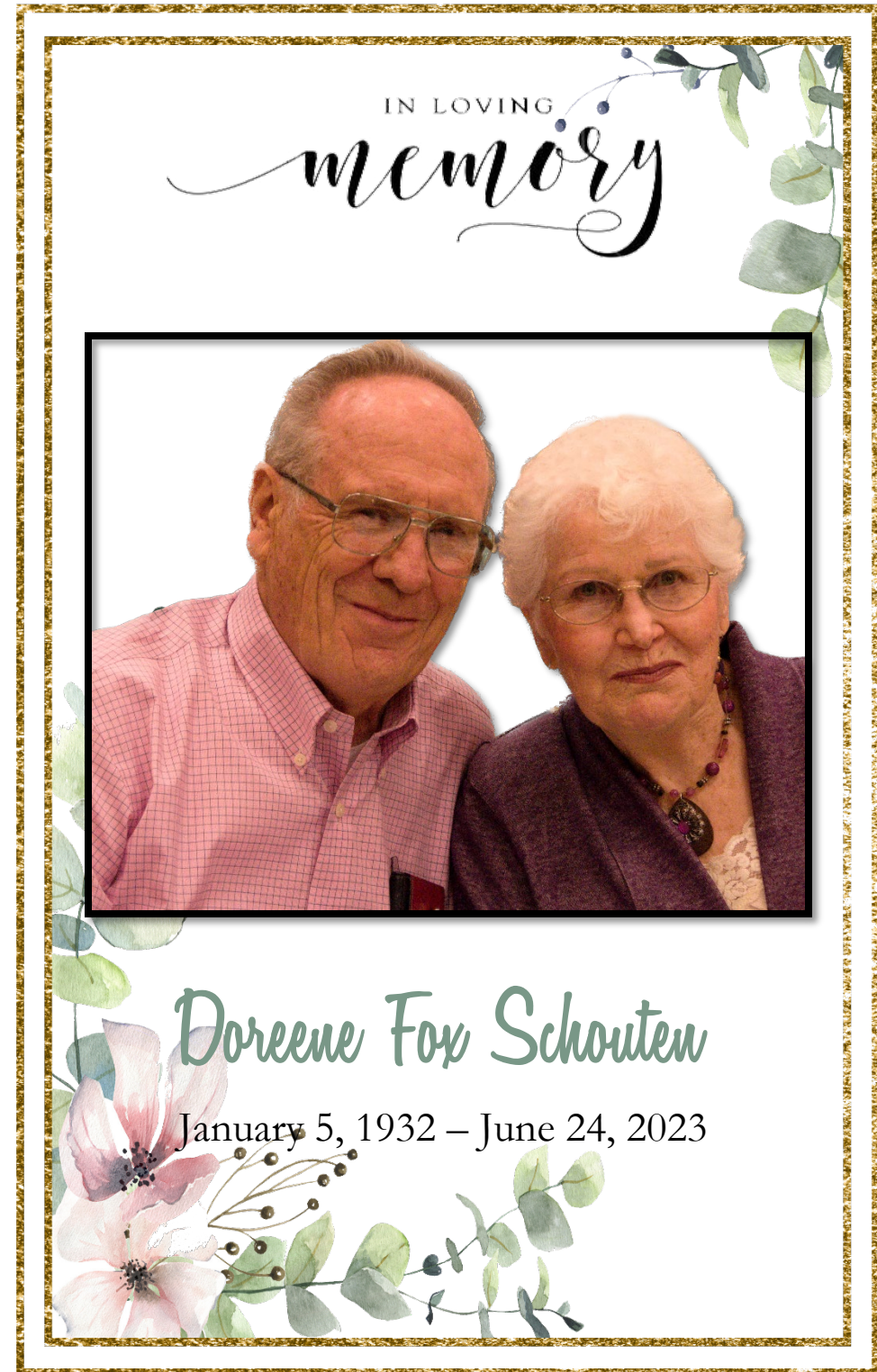

Family vacations were a must every year. Favorite spots included Bear Lake, Arches, and other camping trips. Trips to Disneyland using silver dollars received as birthday presents from grandparents. Family reunions were very important to her. Her annual Thanksgiving/Christmas parties were great events that her whole family looked forward to. She never forgot anyone's birthday and always made sure there was a Christmas card/gift for everyone. Her last moments included thoughts of her family and their care. Instructions to stay faithful, read our scriptures and pray daily.

Doreene slipped away after a week of waiting for heaven's gates. A few last breaths and her spirit was free, a hint of a smile on a face that had been troubled for days.
