





Classroom News

Mrs. Davidson's Class

We are well into our study of Jonah for Bible, and this week we looked especially at the messages of forgiveness in this story and throughout the Bible. Thank God for his mercy and grace on all of us! So far, the students are learning Jonah 2:2 and 2 Peter 3:9 as the treasure verses for this unit. (There will be one more.)

In Social Studies, the lower grades are still studying the U.S. Northeast, this week focusing on the geography and economy of the region. On Thursday they learned some new vocabulary, including the word megalopolis! The upper grades have started their study of Ancient India. Science class has been all about energy in its many forms, and how it changes from one form to another. For P.E., we finished our unit on Stunts and Tumbling with the students performing some short tumbling routines they put together with a partner. On Thursday we started our basketball unit, and practiced some ball handling skills and dribbling. Some of the drills are quite challenging, and I trust students will continue to practice outside of class.
