Eulogy

- Elletta Rosetta Wint, born on March 7th, 1935, was not just the firstborn to her parents, the late George and Linetta Wint, but a beacon of love that radiated through generations. Growing up in the District of Resource, Manchester, Jamaica, Elletta helped her mother raise her five younger siblings. Although her parents were strict, Elletta never received any beatings from her beloved father, much to the disappointment of her younger siblings. Her parents' disciplined yet loving nature shaped her into a compassionate and nurturing individual.
 - Her journey unfolded at the Grove Town All Age School, where she not only excelled academically but also engaged passionately in various activities. After school, Elletta's skills flourished under the tutelage of her grandmother, Mrs. Mary-Jane Copeland, shaping her into a remarkably talented seamstress. She also discovered her love for music and dance, learning to play the piano from a family member, a skill she would later use to bring joy and enrichment to the lives of those around her.
 - At the age of fifteen, Elletta embraced her faith, accepting Jesus as her savior and becoming a baptized member of the Resource Seventh Day Adventist Church. Her devotion to her church and her community would become a cornerstone of her life.
 - In 1957, Elletta embarked on a new chapter, migrating to England and starting a family. She was blessed with her only child, Lorna, in 1958. Four years after her arrival in England, she was joined by her Aunt Vernice, sister Rosabell, and brother Archibald. Elletta's journey in England was filled with family gatherings and work in the garment industry, where she honed her skills as a seamstress and developed a deep knowledge of fine fabrics. Her dedication and kindness were evident to her coworkers, who admired her efficiency and the standard she set.
 - Returning to Jamaica in 1964, Elletta's talent as a seamstress continued to shine. Seeking a better life for her family, she later migrated to the United States and settled in Brooklyn, where her legacy unfolded on the infamous Kosciusko Street. She soon became a proud homeowner of a property on 93rd street. There, she became an integral part of the Brooklyn Temple Seventh Day Adventist Church, serving as a deaconess, Sabbath school member, and choir member with her unwavering alto.
 - Leta's dedication to her church and her community extended far beyond her role as a deaconess. She had a heart for serving others, which she demonstrated in her career as a Certified Nursing Assistant at Calbrini Nursing Home working overnight shifts. For over two decades, Leta cared for the elderly and the sick, providing comfort, compassion, and support to those in need. Her gentle touch and kind words brought solace to the residents, and she was known for going above and beyond to ensure their well-being.
 - In 1994, Leta's life took a beautiful turn when she met and married the love of her life Noel Chambers. Together, they faced the challenges of New York winters, but their love and commitment to each other kept them strong. In 2000, they made the decision to move to Poinciana, Florida, seeking a warmer climate and a new chapter in their lives. It was in Poinciana that Leta's dedication to the Lord continued to shine.
- Leta's service at the Poinciana Seventh Day Adventist Church spanned over twenty years, where she humbly and gracefully shared her love for God and knowledge of the Bible as a Sabbath School Teacher. Her nurturing spirit and ability to connect with each child made her a beloved teacher. As her commitment grew, she took on more responsibilities, becoming the Assistant Community Service Leader, Head Deaconess, and Benevolent Fund Director. Leta's dedication to helping those in need was evident in her involvement in outreach programs and her ability to offer comfort and support. Additionally, her love for music led her to serve as the Choir Director, bringing joy and inspiration to the congregation. Leta's unwavering faith, selflessness, and commitment to her church will be cherished by all who knew her.
- Elletta had a flair for fashion, often expressed through her love for hats. She had a unique ability to match clothing with her sisters, creating vibrant ensembles that mirrored the bond they shared. Every Friday, the aroma of her famous rice and peas or chicken foot soup filled the air, a tradition that brought the family together around the dinner table.
 - Beyond her culinary talents, Elletta's love for music and dance was infectious. Whether it was a joyful celebration or a quiet moment at home, she found solace in the rhythm of life.
 - She had a special love for children, especially her beloved grandchildren Gavin, Sherell, and Bradley Jr. She cherished every moment spent with them, creating lasting memories filled with laughter and love. Elletta's passion for music extended to her grandchildren, as she lovingly taught them to play the piano, sharing her talent and instilling in them a love for music. Her kitchen was always filled with the aroma of delicious meals, as she delighted in cooking for her grandchildren, ensuring they were nourished both in body and soul. She would spend hours entertaining them with stories of her life in Jamaica, painting vivid pictures of her childhood and the vibrant culture she grew up in. Her stories were not just tales of the past, but valuable life lessons that she imparted to her grandchildren and 3 great granddaughters Shayla, Sydney and Nolin, guiding them with her wisdom and love.
 - Her belief in God's healing helped her overcome the odds from an earlier illness in 2018. However, in late August 2023, faced now with a terminal illness, Elletta's spirit remained unbroken. Surrounded by family and friends, she found solace in hymns, songs by The Gaither's, and the melodies of her beloved singer, Jesse Dixon. Despite the pain, her smile, jokes, and encouragement persisted, leaving an enduring message - "It is well with my soul."
 - On December 2, 2023, Elletta Rosetta Chambers peacefully entered eternal rest, but her legacy lives on through her only daughter Lorna and her Son-in-Law Bradley, her grand children Gavin and his wife Jasmine, Sherell and her husband McKinley and Bradley JR (Deceased).
