



After LeRay and Patty married and started their family, he quickly adjusted to being a Dad to which his children have many wonderful memories of time spent together and the many activities they experienced as a family.

LeRay was a very creative man and enjoyed building and restoring many things for his work, his family and friends and for his own personal enjoyment. His grandchildren and great grandchildren looked forward to driving his fun cars, playing on his merry go round and many other fun things he made.
