cheddar, colby, feta, gouda, monterey jack, mozzarella, muenster, provolone, spicy cheeses (i.e. pepper jack), and swiss) and fruits (apples, bananas, blackberries, cherries, mangos, melon, peach, pear, pineapple, plum, ricotta, and strawberry).

Feel free to bring cheese and crackers or sliced fruit, but if you're feeling like making more substantive food, here are some Ideas: jalepeno poppers (any variety of cheese can be used), tomato and mozzarella, fruit salad, fruit tart/crisp/crumble, chicken/pineapple skewers, ham and pineapple, waldorf salad (apples, raisins, pears, etc), spinach/pear/strawberry salad (can probably put feta or other cheese in there, too), blueberry zucchini bread (or any variation thereof!), shortbread or oatmeal cookies with fruit, chicken salad with cranberries/apples/etc, bruschetta, balsamic chicken and mozzarella, mac-n-cheese, quesadillas, cheddar ranch dip, etc. I'll be making apple pie; I believe others have offered brie with fruit toppings and cannoli (mmm, ricotta!).


