Weather Delays/Closings

We have been blessed so far with a mild winter, but things can change rapidly here in central New York. Follow the guidelines below if the weather turns stormy:

Watch for **Parkview Junior Academy** Specifically, (though we typically follow the

actions of the Syracuse City School District, but not always) on channels 3, 5, 9, and 10 to keep up to date about school closings and delays. Usually we are able to get the closings on all of these channels, but some take longer than others, so if you don't see it in one place, check out another. Most channels do a running screen on the bottom of the TV even during commercials. If you have the channel 9 news app on your phone you can check for school closings and delays. Mrs. Kaiser tries to have that information to the television stations by 6 am.
