Stephanie Ann Serleth ("Stevie") left this life after an extended battle with cancer on October 10, 2023. She was surrounded by her husband and children. She was born August 7, 1947 in Brookings, SD. The family moved to Blue Earth, MN where Stevie attended Catholic school through 8th grade then graduated from Blue Earth High School. She earned a B.S. in Education from St. Catherine's in St. Paul, MN. She met life long friends while there and they continued to meet for a long weekend nearly every year including this year. Some of her fondest memories of her years at St. Kate's were the summer jobs she held while attending school there. That chance meeting turned into a whirlwind romance that lasted one day short of 48 years. She flew for United both domestically and internationally for 31 years and enjoyed it immensely. She and Tom lived in Chicago, Larkspur, CA where their children were born, Napa, CA, Portland, OR and, most recently, Alexandria. Stevie found Alexandria to be the place she had been looking to live for her entire life. She loved the lakes and the Alexandria Golf Club. She made many friends through Newcomers Club and Pickleball.
